SURVEY OF BUSINESSES

CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

- Employment and wage estimates by industry
- Measures jobs not number of people employed
- Excludes most agriculture, self-employed, family, and military

SURVEY OF HOUSEHOLDS

LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

- Unemployment, employment and labor force levels by geographic region
- Measures people employed not number of jobs
- Excludes individuals not in the labor force



TYPES OF ANALYSIS DISCUSSED

MONTH-OVER-MONTH

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- Influence of seasonal trends are included
- Main Use: Compare changes with previous years in the same month – comparison with previous years

YEAR-OVER-YEAR

- Numeric/Percentage Change
- Removes influence of seasonal trends
- Main Use: Compare changes with previous time periods – long-term trends (growing, declining, accelerating, or decelerating)



MONTH-OVER-MONTH (MoM) HIGHLIGHTS

- The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate decreased to 3.4% in May 2024 from 3.6% in April 2024
- The U.S. SA unemployment rate increased to 4.0% in May 2024 from 3.9% in April 2024
- Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 10,300 jobs (0.3%)
- Three of 11 major sectors recorded job gains
 - > Job gains were recorded in Manufacturing (1,600 jobs), Other Services (1,400 jobs), and Financial Activities (1,200 jobs)
 - > The largest job losses were recorded in Government (-5,400 jobs) and Leisure and Hospitality (-4,600 jobs)
- Four of the seven Arizona metro areas recorded job gains
 - > The largest percentage gains were recorded in Yuma MSA (0.5%) and Tucson MSA (0.4%)
 - > The largest percentage losses were recorded in Flagstaff MSA (-1.6%) and Phoenix-Mesa-Scottsdale MSA (-0.3%)




YEAR-OVER-YEAR (YoY) HIGHLIGHTS

- Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 63,900 jobs (2.0%)
- Arizona private sector employment increased by 56,100 jobs (2.0%), while government employment increased by 7,800 (1.8%)
- Nine of 11 major sectors recorded job gains
 - > The largest gains were recorded in Private Education and Health Services (37,500 jobs), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (15,900 jobs), and Government (7,800 jobs)
 - > Losses were recorded in Leisure & Hospitality (-7,500 jobs) and Information (-2,600 jobs)
- Six of the seven Arizona metro areas (MSAs) gained jobs
 - > The largest percentage gains were recorded in Phoenix-Mesa-Scottsdale MSA (2.2%) and Yuma MSA (1.8%)
 - > Losses were recorded in Flagstaff MSA (-0.3%)



ARIZONA & U.S. LABOR FORCE YEAR-OVER-YEAR PERCENTAGE CHANGE




Arizona Total Nonfarm Employment







Total Nonfarm Employment by Region









Total Nonfarm Employment by Region


Over-the-Year Percent Gain/Loss






































REPORT SUMMARY

- Month-over-month, Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 10,300 jobs
- Year-over-year, Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 64,600 jobs, or 2.0%
- Ten of the twelve major sectors recorded job gains
 - > Six of the seven Arizona metro areas gained jobs
- The Arizona SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.4% in May 2024
- The Arizona SA labor force increased by 2,023 individuals month-over-month

February 2013 – February 2024




In Arizona, in February 2024 from January 2024:

- The openings rate increased to 5.2% from 4.2%
- The quits rate increased to 2.4% from 2.3%


Notable Changes:

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX YEAR-OVER-YEAR PERCENT CHANGE









U.S. NEW PRIVATE HOUSING UNITS AUTHORIZED BY BUILDING PERMITS













ARIZONA & U.S. LABOR FORCE YEAR-OVER-YEAR PERCENTAGE CHANGE









MONTH-OVER-MONTH EMPLOYMENT LOSS COMPARISON












